## ~Speed Mentoring~



A *Collaboratory* is an organizational entity that spans distance, supports rich and recurring human interaction oriented to a common research area, and fosters contact between researchers who are known and unknown to each other...(Bos et al. 2007). The NHCGNE Collaboratory is designed to support scientific interaction and exchange between senior and early career scientists that might support future research collaboration for care of older adults, in general, and in particular for care of Alzheimer's family caregivers.

**Eligibility:** Open to all conferees **BUT** designed for early career scientists and researchers new to the field of aging. Applicants must hold a doctoral degree or be an enrolled doctoral student. There are **30** slots available on a first come, first served basis.

Participants will be randomly assigned to meet with three different senior scientists to receive one-on-one mentoring.
