The NHCGNE Board of Directors and Mentor Committee is excited to announce the call for the first cohort of NHCGNE's Mentor Program.

The purpose of this program is to provide support and guidance to NHCGNE members who are late-stage PhD Students, post-docs or early-career faculty.

AREAS OF SUPPORT

Areas for Support and Guidance will vary depending on career stage and location but may include:

- Professional and Career Development
- Critical Thinking and Strategies for Transitioning from Student to Faculty

ELEGIBILITY

Individuals are Eligible to be a MENTEE if they are a:

- Member of NHCGNE or a Student at a Member School
- Late- Stage PhD Nursing Student, Post-Docs, or Early-Career Faculty with less than 3 Years of Experience.

INFORMATION FOR PHD STUDENTS

PhD student mentees will have their institutional advisor(s); therefore there will be no expectation of mentors to provide feedback on scholarly projects like dissertations, abstracts, etc.

EXPECTATIONS

Mentees will be expected to initiate contact with their assigned mentor and establish mentorship program goals and communication times and methods (e.g, telephone, email, Zoom). An evaluation will be sent to the mentor and mentee at the end of the program. A brief overview of the program and mentoring tips will be provided.

MATCHING

Mentees and Mentors will be matched by the NHCGNE Mentor Committee.

PROGRAM DATES

The Mentor Program Period will be from **January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021**.
The online application will be open from **November 1, 2020 to November 30, 2020**.

- Have at Least 5 Years of Experience as a Faculty Member
